Archbishop Edwards and other Canadian bishops have met privately at Niagara Falls this week to choose nominees for the position of Primate of the national church. Nominees will be current Canadian bishops or bishops of other churches in full communion with the Anglican Church of Canada. Names of those nominated will be announced later this morning. Choice of nominees falls exclusively to the bishops, but it is also their only role in Primate selection. The Primate will be elected at this June's General Synod by a vote of the clerical and lay delegates. Election requires a simple majority in each order.
